6. Treasurer's Report – Eve O'Donnell (on behalf of Justyna Mullin)

- The PA will make a disbursement of c. €4k to each of the schools
- The PA would like to promote greater transparency around where the funds are spent and will work with the schools on how best to achieve this

7. Fundraising:

- a) Calendar Sales Patrick Johnston
- Sponsors were asked to pre-pay for their ads this year which worked extremely well. The certainty of money being paid upfront meant funds were available to cover the cost of printing and reduced the likelihood of having to chase payment. There is c. €1,800 outstanding (majority of this is from previous years and will likely be written off).

- 8. Upcoming events
 - a) Table Quiz *Nicole Byrne*
 - February 1st in Clontarf Golf Club
 - c. 132 tickets available, cost €10 pp
 - Nicole to send an email to Pat/Mary with details of the event and a notice will go out to parents
 - Request for raffle prizes from businesses (no unwanted gifts please). If any parents can help in this regard, it is greatly appreciated.
- 9. School Hall Kitchen *Lorraine Ousby*
 - Both principals are happy with the plans and for the upgrade to go ahead
 - Aim is for the kitchen to go in during Easter break; ensure Martin/Peter are available for school access.
 - Two (similar) quotes received, but a parent mentioned they could likely get a better price. Lorraine to follow up on this.
- 10. Cairn Homes development on Griffith Avenue and its implications on traffic in the area *Eve* O'Donnell
 - Developer is seeking fast-track planning permission from An Bord Pleanála for a large development of 347 apartments/7 houses and creche beside Marino Institute (entrance on Griffith Avenue)
 - The issue raised several concerns with those in attendance:
 - Health and safety of students walking/cycling to school through the construction area on Griffith Avenue;
 - Traffic and parking;
 - Significant influx of residents may result in prospective students residing in the catchment area not getting places in the school.
 - The PA Committee is wondering whether there is remit for a response to be made on behalf of the Parents Association. The Board of Management indicated they might submit a response.
 - The PA Committee is urging everyone to get informed and respond to the application
- 11. Preparing survey for parents Eve O'Donnell
 - A parent raised a concern about mobile phones and peer pressure. Further discussion to be had at the next PA meeting.
- 12. Buddy bench proposal *Claire Fitzpatrick*
 - A company called Buddy Bench Ireland is providing a school-based mental health program that empowers children to foster friendships and eliminate loneliness in the yard. It also releases the stigma of asking for help.
 - Claire to get more information and principals to speak to teachers to gauge buy-in
 - Similar idea of a "Friendship Stop" was proposed
- 13. Other
 - A parent raised an issue about head lice in the school and provided information about a company that can offer screening to students. Further consideration to be given to the matter.
